Lord, register of probate for said county, hereby certify that satisfactory evidence has been produced to the judge of probate for said county, by the affidavits of Solomon Blood, of Dracut, and Charles Blood, of Chelmsford, in the county of Middlesex and commonwealth aforesaid, who are certified to be persons of truth and veracity, that Parzellai Sew, late of Dracut in said county of Middlesex, cooper, deceased, intestate, was reputed to have been a soldier in the war of the revolution; that he died in said Dracut on the nineteenth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty two, that he left at his decease Dinah Sew, his widow; that the said Dinah Sew afterwards removed from said Dracut to Andover in said county of Essex, that she died in said Andover on the first day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven, that she left at her decease five children, and no more, viz. Parzellai Sew, Dinah Freeman, Lemmi Sew, ~~Phebe Hoop~~ and Lucy Dalton, all of whom are still living and of full age, except said Lemmi Sew, who died on the ninth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, and said Phebe Hoop, who died on the seventh day of December one thousand eight hundred and fifty three.

Barrillai Sew, a resident of Andover, in the County of Essex in said State, aged seventy seven years, who first being duly sworn according to law; doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 4th 1836, on account of the Revolutionary war, of his Father Barrillai Sew; deceased, as herein after described and in behalf of his mother Dinah Sew; deceased widow of said Barrillai Sew; This declarant further saith that said Barrillai Sew; departed this life in the town of Dracutt, in the County of Middlesex in said State, on the thirtieth day of January, in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty two leaving the said Dinah Sew; his widow, that the said Dinah Sew, after the death of her said husband the said Barrillai Sew; moved from said town of Dracutt, to said town of Andover, that she continued to remain the widow of said Barrillai Sew; untill the day of her death, which occurred in the said town of Andover, on the first day of January in year Eighteen hundred and thirty seven; that her maiden name was Dinah Bowman; that she was married to the said Barrillai Sew, in the town of Groton in the County of Middlesex in said State

That Barrillai Sew, named in the statement of the time of births of the different children of the said Barrillai Sew, represents this declarant, and that of his two sisters, in said statement; To wit; The original statement made in the said record of said Barrillai Sew, which accompanies this declaration, The following named only survive and they still survive and are all over twenty one years old. viz. Barrillai Sew, this declarant, born February 4th 1777, Dinah Sew, born January 25th 1784, Lucy Sew; born May 7th 1790 and that Isadore Sew, born April 29th 1768, Amy Sew, born December 8th 1771, Serviah Sew, born June 26th 1773, Eusebia Sew, born April 26th 1775, Peter Sew, born January

28.th 1779, Peophas Sew, born August 21.st 1780, Eric
 Sew, born March 21.st 1782, Simon Sew, born November
 27.th 1785, Phoebe Sew, born April 20.th 1788, Adriastra
 Sew, born December 23, 1793, are all of them deceased
 and this declarant further saith that his father the said
 Barnilla's Sew served as a Soldier in the war of the Revolution
 from the Town of Chelmsford in said County of Middlesex
 in said State, in the eight month service in the year Seventeen
 hundred and Seventy five, in a Company commanded by
 Captain John Ford, from said Town of Chelmsford, that
 he also served at Concord under said Captain John Ford
 in the year Seventeen hundred and Seventy six - as he has
 often heard his father the said Barnilla's Sew, relate, that
 it is his impression from what he has heard his said father
 relate, that he rendered other services in said war at which
 he is unable to describe at this time, all of which would amount
 to two years and upwards, that he was not a war until within
 two years ago, that the Children of the aforesaid Barnilla Sew
 were entitled to the amount of pension, which she died
 entitled to,
